Stellenbosch Business School invites the submission of abstracts for the 25th Global Conference on Environmental Taxation (GCET25) to be held in person in Stellenbosch, South Africa, from 18 to 20 September 2024.

The conference theme, **Towards a Just Energy Transition**, provides a global platform to foster participatory and inclusive climate change dialogue between the Global North and South about the role of environmental taxation and other market-based policies. Contributions by academic scholars, experts from international bodies, government agencies, NGOs and the private sector are welcome.

We invite submissions on the following broad topics (but not limited to):

- Policy instruments for a just energy transition
- Carbon taxation
- Emissions trading scheme
- Carbon border adjustment mechanism
- Green fiscal reform
- Climate justice
- Biodiversity protection
- Environmental taxes

The extended submission deadline is **1 May 2024**. Abstracts will be accepted on a rolling basis, so that early notifications might be made, allowing participants to register early for the conference.

Format and style of abstracts

Abstracts should not exceed 400 words. No figures, tables, footnotes, endnotes or other references should be included in the abstract. Abstracts will be submitted via [Google Forms](#), by copying and pasting the text in the relevant fields. Please also submit a short bio of up to 150 words with main biographical details of the presenting author. These bios may be included in the conference book of abstracts.

GCET25 Young Researcher Award

One of the key objectives of GCET is the promotion of junior contributions and the fostering of state-of-the-art scientific research. Accordingly, any student or researcher younger than 35 (as at 1 April 2024) can be a candidate for the “GCET25 Young Researcher Award”.
